- Exit #37 (East Canton), left at bottom of ramp
- Right on Hwy 19/23 all the way into Canton
- Just before bridge, turn left on Hwy 110 South (Sorrells St.)
- Go 6 miles on Hwy 110, cross over Hwy 276, going straight, where the road becomes Hwy 215 (Love Joy Road).
