DeKalb County Community Gardens Today

- Nearly 40 garden sites County Wide (14 schools and 25 community sites)
- Over 200 5' by 10' raised garden beds
- Over 15 Acres of Food Growing Area
- 2013 DCCG donated over 16,000 pounds of food up from 2,500 in 2012.
- DCCG has developed over 60 community partnerships & sponsors; including businesses, organizations, agencies, and municipalities.
- Over 300 volunteers throughout the growing season!



Food Insecurity and DeKalb County

- 13,920 or 13.4% Residents are facing food insecurity
- 5,986 are ineligible for public benefits
- 4,560 or 19.7% children facing food insecurity.
- Nearly 2,189 of these children are not eligible for free/reduced price lunch because their family income is too high



DeKalb Community Gardens Community Orchard and Forest Garden Projects

DCCG, in partnership with the DeKalb County Forest Preserve District, is installing a community orchard at the DeKalb County government outreach campus and the Old State Forest Garden at Old State and Five Points.



Employment and Job Skills Training

DeKalb County Community Gardens is working to expand into providing more employment for residents of DeKalb County. DCCG is also uniquely positioned to offer job training skills to area residents of various ages. Through the partnerships with Hope Haven, the County homeless shelter, the Youth Service Bureau, and their work with youth at risk, and with Northern Illinois University, DCCG is offering many valuable job skill training opportunities, as well as valuable community service experiences.

Education

DeKalb County Community Gardens is involved in community education. In partnership with the University of Illinois Extension, Kishwaukee Health Systems, and others, DCCG is teaching citizens about how to grow, prepare, and preserve wholesome fresh foods. In addition to providing educational opportunities related to food, DCCG is also increasing awareness about natural, sustainable growing methods to preserve local eco-systems, and increase biodiversity.

Communiversity Gardens

DCCG is also entering into a partnership with Northern Illinois University to create the first communiversity garden. This will join the community with the university in working together to provide access to fresh food, international foods, education, environmental awareness, and social entrepreneurial opportunities and training. This is a new exciting project for the 2014 growing season.

Art in the Gardens

DeKalb County Community Gardens is also involved with the promotion of the arts through the Art in the Gardens Program. DCCG has partnered with the Sycamore Art Attack to have an art projects related to nature in the gardens. In the first year of the program young people created murals for the gardens.
