In year one, participants will gain the skills to work with producers to develop an electronic record keeping system.

In year two, participants will build on these skills to assist producers in developing and utilizing financial statements to guide business decisions.

In the final year of the program, participants will learn to assist producers to assess the financial health, market channel profitability, and calculate key metrics, including costs of production and breakeven levels.

DESCRIPTION:

Thanks to funding from a Northeast SARE Grant, we are offering 25 agricultural service providers the opportunity to build their farm financial skills through on-line learning coupled with direct client/on-farm application. This format will benefit both the service providers and the farmers alike!

Each year, participants will take part in five, 90-minute web-based educational sessions.

This three year program will educate participants in basic accounting skills, developing a QuickBooks based bookkeeping system, and analyzing farms' financial health.

Participants will learn these concepts and then build their skills through application on two farms that they select. Participants will supported by veteran coaches who will help answer questions and provide them feedback.
