

Fig. 10. *Left:* Insect exclusion netting (ProtekNet, 25 gram, 14 ft width, Dubois Agrinovation) set up over width of bed planted to *Brassicas*. 10-ft metal electrical conduit (Lowe's) bent with a hoop bender (Johnny's) is used to make the hoops to hold up the exclusion netting (1 hoop every 4-6 feet). Fiberglass rod posts (Zareba 48 inch, Tractor Supply Co., cut in half) are used to anchor the hoops, and snap clamps (for ½ inch EMT, Johnny's Selected Seeds) are used to hold netting onto hoops (need 2 per hoop). Netting is secured at ground with rocks or clods of sod. *Right:* A knotted sleeve made out of exclusion netting allows researchers to easily access swede midge trap without allowing swede midge to enter or escape the netting.
