


## **Engagement with the Honey Co-op model**





3. Are you interested in beekeeping as a business or selling honey?

## Other Benefits/Take Aways:

- 1. More support with grant writing for Hawaii beekeepers is needed.
- 2. If a co-op could support members in finding and getting access to commercial kitchens, members could expand the value-added options made on Hawaii Island.
- 3. A co-op might be able to put busy hive owners together with available hive managers
- 4. Assist with buying affordable jars in bulk.
- 5. Making honey and hive products available consistently to others in the coop and for the outside market.
- 6. Encourage Big Island beekeepers to get together more to help reduce the cost of equipment and potentially do research on honey variants.
