

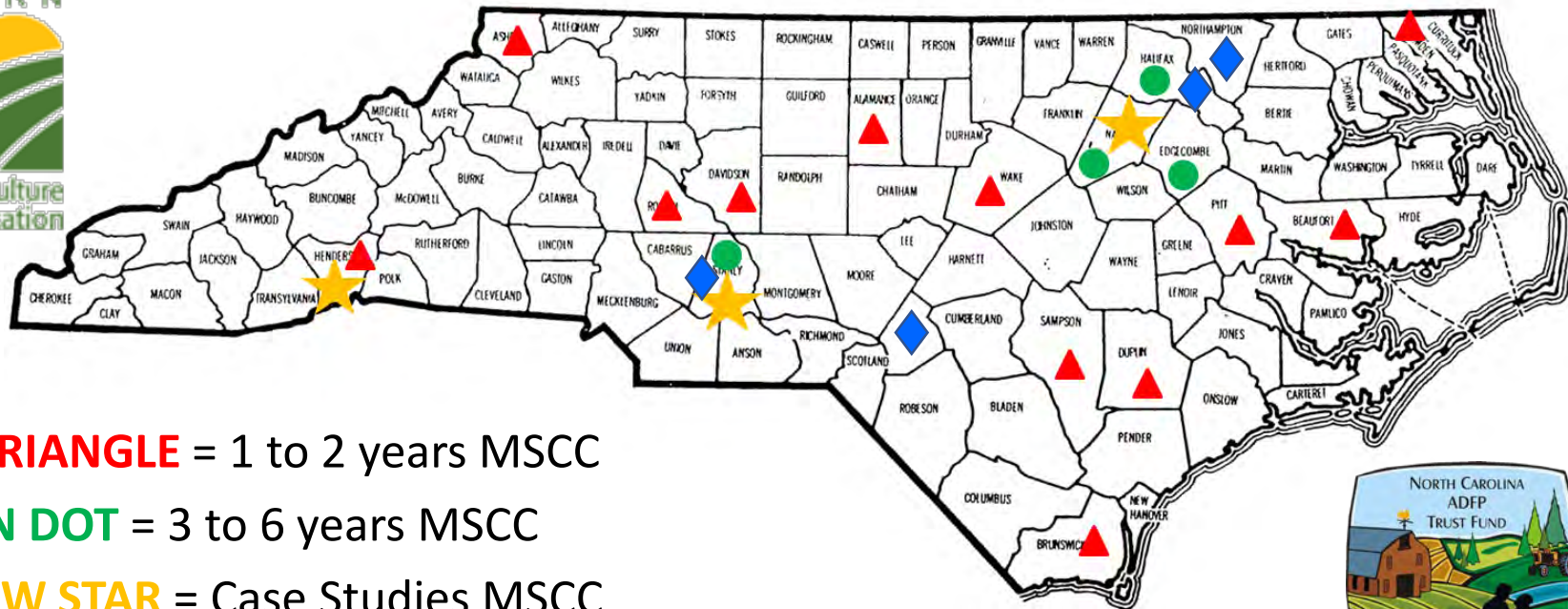

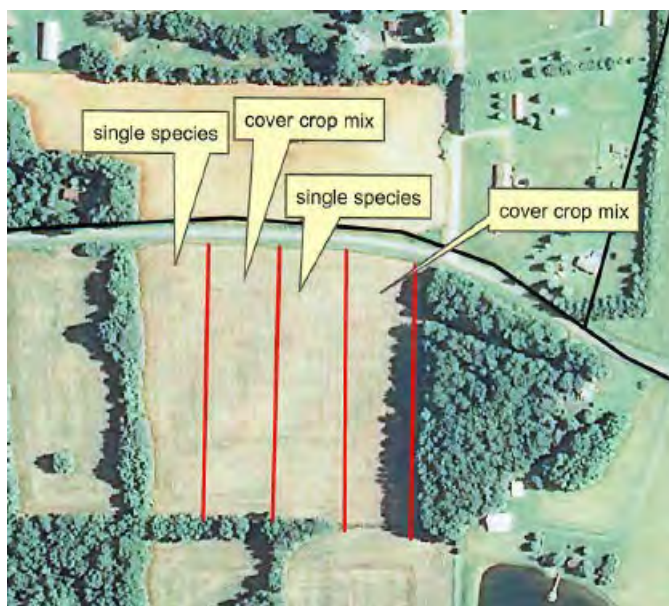


- **RED TRIANGLE** = 1 to 2 years MSCC

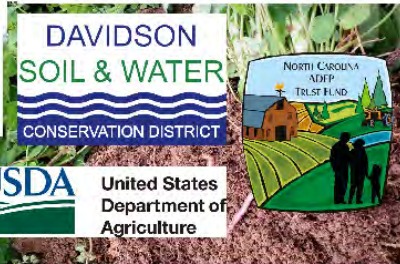

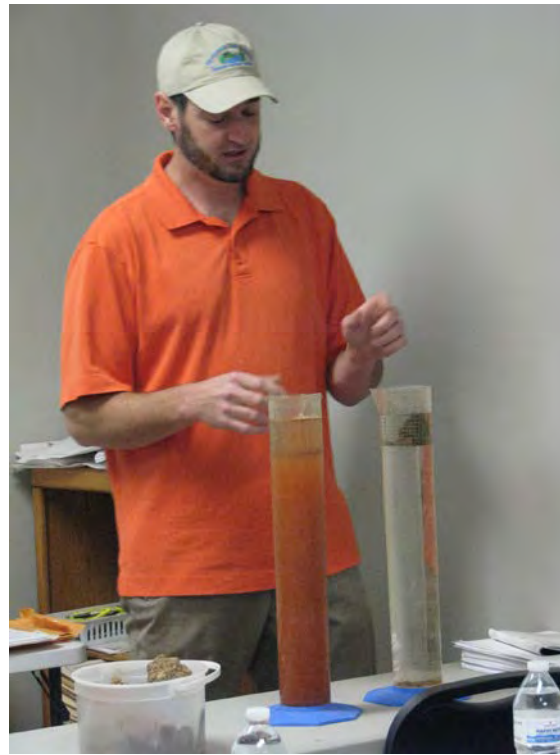
