SESSION 1 – Organic 101: history and background of organic and the USDA National Organic Program; Organic Certification, Organic Standards and Guidelines; and Resources

Presenter: Ben Bowell – Organic Conservation Specialist with Oregon Tilth and FPAC/NRCS in Portland, OR.

Ben Bowell is an Organic Conservation Specialist for Oregon Tilth, a national non-profit organic certification and education organization. Through his joint position with NRCS, he provides technical assistance, delivers trainings, and develops technical resources for use by NRCS staff and organic professionals in order to better support conservation work on organic farms. Ben first became interested in agriculture as a student at Wake Forest University and while completing his degree he worked on small-scale farms in North Carolina. He pursued this interest and received a M.S. from Tufts University's Agriculture, Food, and Environment Program during which he completed an internship at the Institute of Organic Agriculture in Bonn, Germany.

SESSION 2 – Iowa Organic Research | Overview of Organic Markets

Presenter: Kathleen Delate Ph.D. – Iowa State University professor and Extension organic specialist

Dr. Delate leads the ISU Extension organic research and extension program. Her research focuses on nutrient and pest management strategies that enhance production while lowering agriculture's environmental footprint. She works in Ames, Iowa, and at the ISU Neely-Kinyon Farm in Greenfield, Iowa. In addition to hosting the Annual Iowa Organic Conference each November, she offers a "Transitioning to Organic" course every other year through ISU.
