Members of the RMG group met at King Ranch near Winnett. We went to <u>Yellow Water Range pasture</u> (must be logged in to view) near one of Roland Kroos's monitoring transect sites and did an <u>infiltration test</u> and had a good discussion around soil quality. Rick Caquelin gave an outline of the soil biology sampling which should take place in June, and there was good discussion of indicators such as soil organic matter (which Western Sustainability Exchange is doing) as well as infiltration, which covers some of the aggregate stability that is a key indicator of soil health.

More in-person time on the land, what tools work for you


The discussion on the land was powerful. Multiple perspectives, on an infiltration test for example, are enriching.
