

Resource Inventory Checklist

"Starting the Conversation"

Introduction:

The On-Farm Resource Inventory is a tool to help you start the conversation of whole farm planning with yourself, your family, your peers, and your local natural resource professionals. Answering the questions in the inventory will provide you with the opportunity to collect your thoughts, evaluate your resources, and formulate a plan to protect your land for future generations.

The farm inventory checklist is divided into three sections. Each section will be provided to you at the Women & Land meetings to help you prepare for the upcoming session discussion. By the final session, you will have put together a thoughtful description of your land, farming operation, and future plans and potential that can be shared with your family, tenants, and conservation agency staff as a starting place for planning and action on your land.

SECTION I-Overview

Section I of the inventory consists of open-ended questions intended to help you start gathering your thoughts on your "big picture" goals for your land. Think of these questions as a brainstorming activity. This section is merely a place to capture your thoughts on paper. There are no right or wrong answers. Hopefully these questions will help you better define what farming and the land means to you and get you excited to participate in "Women & Land".

- 1. Do you actively farm your land?
- 2. Do you have a tenant farmer?
- 3. If you have a tenant farmer, what do you find positive about this relationship? What is challenging about this relationship?
- 4. If you are farming the land, why are you farming? If you plan to farm, why do you want to farm?
- 5. If you are not farming but have a tenant farmer, why do you want to be involved in the farming operation?
- 6. What do you want your role(s) to be on the farm? (I.E. Owner, Manager, Labor, Silent Observer)
- 7. What is your vision or big picture goal for your land or farm?

- 8. Do you need to make a profit from the farm? *Explain your answer*.
- 9. What are the strengths/beneficial features of your land or farm?
- 10. What are the problem areas/challenges of your land or farm?
- 11. What are your strengths do you contribute to your land or farm?
- 12. What are your weaknesses relating to the farm?

SECTION II-Farm & Operation

Section II is to be completed before the second learning circle. Now that you have your "big picture" thoughts and goals on paper, this section focuses on the farm, the farm operation, and conservation on your farm. It assesses both the current operation and future plans. You are encouraged to answer these questions based on both your current situation and your future or desired situation.

Completing this section before the second learning circle will help you make the most of the conservation planning discussion during the second session as you will already have given great thought to the characteristics and qualities of your own farm. Finally, completing this section will highlight areas where you may need assistance or want more information. It will assist you in forming questions specific to your farm and your operation to ask the natural resource professionals attending the second session.

Instructions: Circle the appropriate letter(s) in each question. You may not have all of the types of farming discussed in this checklist, so may skip the questions that are not relevant to your operation. If there are current and future and boxes, check the box most appropriate for your current or future plans. If a tenant is farming your land, use the current column to describe their operation. If you would like to make changes to the tenant's operation, indicate your plans using the future column. If you don't understand a question, be sure to ask about it at the next circle. If you "don't know" an answer, think about asking a natural resource professional about the topic either during the circle, in a follow-up office visit, or when you have them out to your farm.

SECTION III-Planning for the Future

Section III is to be completed before the last learning circle. This section focuses on future planning. The topics of discussion are leases, financial planning, succession planning, and the next steps you may wish to commit to taking. Completing this section before the circle will prepare you to have an informed discussion on leases, farm lending, alternatives to selling the farm, and what questions you may want to ask conservation professionals about taxes, easements and the difference between LLCs, trusts, and foundations.

This section also lays the groundwork for setting your intention to continue the learning process, as well as setting your intention to put your desires into action. You will finish the section by writing down a few small (or large), simple (or grand) steps you wish to take to move forward with your conservation goals. You will have the opportunity at the final circle to discuss your plan with your peers. In addition, you will have the opportunity to set up site visits at your farm with natural resource professionals.

Instructions: Circle the appropriate letter(s) in each question. Not all the questions may pertain to your farming operation, so skip the questions that are not relevant to your situation. If you don't understand a question, be sure to ask about it at the next circle. If you "don't know" an answer, think about asking a natural resource professional about the topic either during the circle, in a follow-up office visit, or when you have them out to your farm. In the last question, write down the actions you want to take on your farm and the expected month for taking action.
