Activity for Week One

Each week, we will have you complete activities and report back on what you found in the forum.

This week, please provide responses to the questions below in this forum:

1 - Please visit the greenhouse you plan to use for your scouting assignments throughout the course. Please report back on the primary crops growing in the greenhouse?

2 - Did you meet the greenhouse grower? If so, did you discuss any particular challenges or goals regarding scouting?

3 - Please try out the hand lens and optivisor you received in the mail. Did they work well for you? Do you have a preference for one over the other?

4 - We would also like you to practice a technique for monitoring fungus gnat larvae in the greenhouse. You'll need a potato for this activity. Cut a $\frac{1}{4}$ " wedge or slice out of your potato. Insert the potato in the growing media of a pot in the greenhouse. Monitor the potato over the next few days and look for fungus gnat larvae; you should see feeding damage on the potato relatively quickly. Please report back in the Q&A on Moodle on what you found after monitoring for fungus gnats using a potato wedge. You might consider posting a photo of your potato wedge after monitoring it for a few days.
