## **Program Description**

Agricultural producers growing food for local consumption and farmers markets provide an important source of fresh, locally raised, food and produce. They also comprise an important element of the local economy by keeping dollars in the community.

The SARE (Sustainable Agriculture Research & Education) program of the USDA is funding a day -long workshop facilitated by UI Extension in partnership with Clearwater County Economic Development. This workshop will target ag producers focused on local food sales and farmers market managers in the communities of the upper Clearwater River basin.

Several presenters with expertise in these areas will be part of the program, with topics directed at farmers market managers in the morning, and topics of interest to farmers market vendors and local food producers in the afternoon.



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
