This two-day workshop is designed for forestry professionals interested in becoming [Technical Service Providers](#) (TSPs) for the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). TSPs have expertise in conservation planning and design for a variety of activities and are hired by forest owners to provide these services on behalf of NRCS. Becoming a TSP can expand the resources you offer your clients.

Workshop participants will be guided through the registration process and training modules required to become a TSP. This training will also include sessions and resources to efficiently manage projects and promote the [Environmental Quality Incentives Program](#) (EQIP) to current and prospective clients. EQIP is a cost-share program that can fund the development of forest plans, wildlife habitat enhancement activities, and forestry practices. Landowners use EQIP and other NRCS cost-share programs as a resource to achieve their conservation and management goals.
