The advantages and procedures for using the PSNT are discussed in Fact Sheets 569 and 760. To use the PSNT effectively, however, growers and crop consultants need accurate soil test results as quickly as possible if they are to make timely nutrient application decisions. A soil sampling probe with a tube that can extract 12-inch soil cores is also needed. The purpose of this fact sheet is to list the potential options for testing equipment and some available soils labs that can perform the test. Prices and turnaround time may vary, and this list is in no way meant to be an endorsement of any products or soils laboratories listed. Other suppliers or laboratories may be used. It is recommended that you call the soil testing laboratories first to make sure results can be obtained within the time remaining to apply sidedress nitrogen applications. Many labs will report results for the PSNT by telephone or FAX.
