In addition, we will be discussing common small grain and dry bean plant diseases and insect pests. We'll demonstrate scouting techniques and have "cheat-sheets" available to help with identification.


The Grain Tour is a **Free Event** and snacks will be provided by the NOFA-VT Pizza oven showcasing local grains/wheat.


