After lunch, from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m., we will have several afternoon sessions that you can choose from to attend (will need to pick one).

- **Soil Health**—Come hear the tales a soil pit can tell. Learn about inherent and dynamic soil properties. Observe soil critters that help nutrient cycling. See dung beetles in action and their effect on soil health. Discuss management trade-offs and biodiversity's impact and balance on the landscape.
- **Malt Barley**—Learn about growing and malting barley from UVM Extension and Andrea Stanley from Valley Malt. Participate in a malt taste and aroma session with UVM's sensory expert Roy Desrochers.
- **Pollinator Protection** - Join UVM Extension and the Xerces Society to learn about pollinators and strategies such as planter modifications to manage risks from pesticides. The VAAFM will provide information on new rules and regulations focused on pollinator protection.
- **Forages**—Join us to discuss managing forage crops for optimal yield and quality to feed more forage. We'll be joined by dairy nutritionists Patrice Vincent and Kurt Cotanch and grazing expert Sarah Flack. We'll discuss the impacts of cutting height and timing on yield, quality, and species persistence, equipment adjustments for harvest and seeding, and much more.
- **Hemp Processing Demo**—Join for a conversation on hemp fiber. We will take a walk through the various fiber trials and discuss best growing practices for the northeast. See items made from our research fiber and try your hand at the scutching sword. A demo will outline the process from the breaking of stalks to the spinning of yarn, and we will also touch on a bit of the retting process.
