What is the Food Hub?

The Food Hub is modeled after Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) programs in which people from a community pledge to support their local farms by becoming members or "shareholders" of a farm. However the Food Hub differs from the traditional CSA model in two key ways.

 The Food Hub is a multi-farm program in which produce and products from about 20 core farms are combined to create the weekly shares. 2) Members of the Food Hub are not shareholders of any of these farms; meaning that while they are supporting local farms, they do not share in the bounty or scarcity of any particular crops. Farmers receive fair prices for their crops while members receive the retailequivalent of the value they pay for in those crops, delivered to their workplace.

Why Buy Local?

Taste — Most food today travels an average of 1300 miles from farm to plate. Buying local means getting tastier and more nutritious food onto your plate, sometimes less than 24 hours after it is picked!

Economy— Buying local means that your food dollars are reinvested in your community and local economy at least twice as much as when you buy out-of-state products from big chain stores.

Small Farms— Supporting small farms preserves the health and well-being of the farmers, the land and the surrounding communities.

Health - Know exactly how your food was grown and who grew it. Enjoy the power of choice to avoid food grown with harmful chemicals and practices.

Environment— Most states import 85-90% of their food supply. Buying local cuts down on pollution from trucking, extra processing and conventional agriculture.

Summer Food Hub Shares

Vegetable \$525 This 21-week plan brings together growers from around the region to showcase the delicious Vermont harvest. Each week, receive fresh greens and a mix of 7-10 vegetables, ranging from mushrooms and carrots to cabbages and onions. The share will easily feed a family of two to three veggie-friendly people. **Small Vegetable** \$350 This 21-week share is a smaller version of the Vegetable share, perfect for one to two people. You will receive most of the same veggies as the larger version, just in smaller quantities. \$295 Fruit & Berry From June through September, enjoy the best organic and/or ecologically grown fruits and berries in Vermont. This share will take you through the local season, starting with strawberries and cherries and finishing with apples and cider. bi-weekly - \$65 weekly - \$125 Eggs From June to October, receive one dozen fresh, pasture-raised local eggs delivered either bi-weekly or weekly. Cheese \$200 Receive one variety of local artisan cheese every week from Does' Leap Farm (goat), Mt Mansfield Creamery (cow), and Willow Hill Farm (sheep) on a rotating basis. Bread \$110 Receive one loaf of artisan bread every week from either Red Hen or August 1st. Varieties of loaves will vary. \$45 Sauerkraut Receive one quart of Arethusa Farm's sauerkraut every month. Pesto \$35 Receive 6oz of certified organic pesto from Bella Farm every month. Chicken \$130 Receive organic, pastured chicken - one 5 pound bird a month delivered frozen from June to October. Sausage & Burger Share \$215 Receive a 25 lb combination of organic and grass-fed ground beef and a diversity of pasture-raised sausages, delivered frozen over 5 months. Meat Sampler \$250 Receive a 25 lb combination of pastured beef, pork, lamb and two chickens, delivered frozen over 5 months. 1/2 litre - \$75 1 litre - \$100 Maple Svrup Receive a 1/2 litre bottle or a one litre bottle of Dragonfly Sugarworks Medium Amber maple syrup every month for 5 months.

\$105 Flower Bouquet

Receive one \$20 bouquet from Stray Cat Farm every month.

How Will My Food Arrive?

Shares will arrive bundled and placed in baskets. Meats will be frozen and wrapped. If you're going a long distance or planning to stay at work after delivery, please come prepared with a cooler or make other arrangements to keep your food fresh.

How Do I Pay?

Member enrollment begins in February 2010 and continues until May 15th or until all shares are sold. Membership is available on a first come, first served basis. Members can pay in full at sign up or they can pay in five equal monthly installments with 20% due at sign up and 20% due each consecutive month thereafter. Additional payment plans will be considered upon request. We encourage full payment as promptly as possible because early payment benefits farmers! Balance must be paid in full by August 31, 2010.
