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Explore ways to transition land to an agroforestry system - adding diversity, markets, and income to your farm. Learn about sustainable fruit production research being conducted at Hilltop Community Farm and discover ways to design and implement an agroforestry system – considering sustainability at all levels. We'll also share resources and lessons we are learning from the field as we attempt to grow uncommon yet marketable fruits such as aronia, quince, currant, saskatoon and others. In addition to expanding unique varieties of Midwest – grown fruits, these species exhibit much potential for organic production, are high yielding, environmentally friendly, and are an exceptionally nutritional food source.

We are expanding upon the successful research conducted by Dale and Cindy Secher of Carandale Farms in Oregon, WI – testing the adaptability of the eight most successful varieties from their trials to different regional growing conditions. Growing these fruits can lead to increased economic viability for small – mid-sized farms. There will be a mix of round-table discussion, hands-on activities, and a site tour. Lunch and snacks provided. You will leave the day with plant lists, resources on growing these fruits, and a base map for scheming and dreaming up your own agroforestry system.
