#### **Women Landowners Matter**

- Women own or co-own half of Iowa farmland
- Most women rent land to tenants
- Women express strong conservation values

#### **Women Landowners Are**

- Often inheritors who keep their land for legacy reasons
- Sixty-one percent are 65+
- Strong conservation partners when informed and supported

#### **Women Landowners Need:**

- Knowledge about best management practices and conservation
- Support from other women in talking with tenants
- Outreach materials designed for them, not the tenant

#### **Learning Circles**

- Informal, peer-to-peer, women-only meetings
- Women share vision and challenges for land
- Female conservation professionals present
- · Simple demonstration activities
- Includes a field tour

### Women Are Improving Conservation

• 66% of meeting participants took at least one conservation action within a year.
