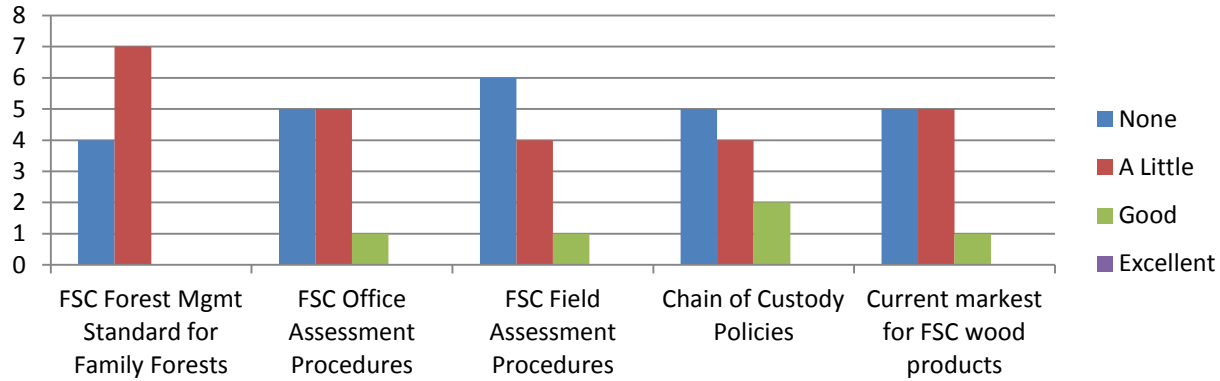
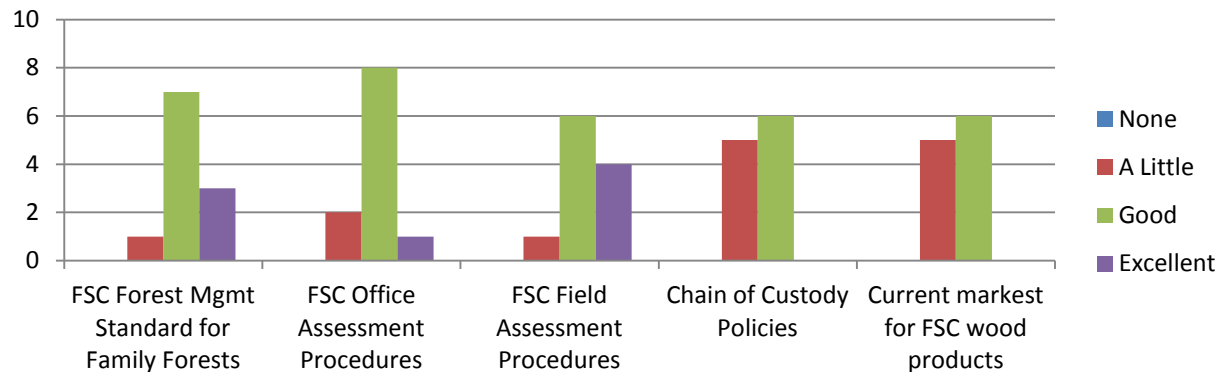

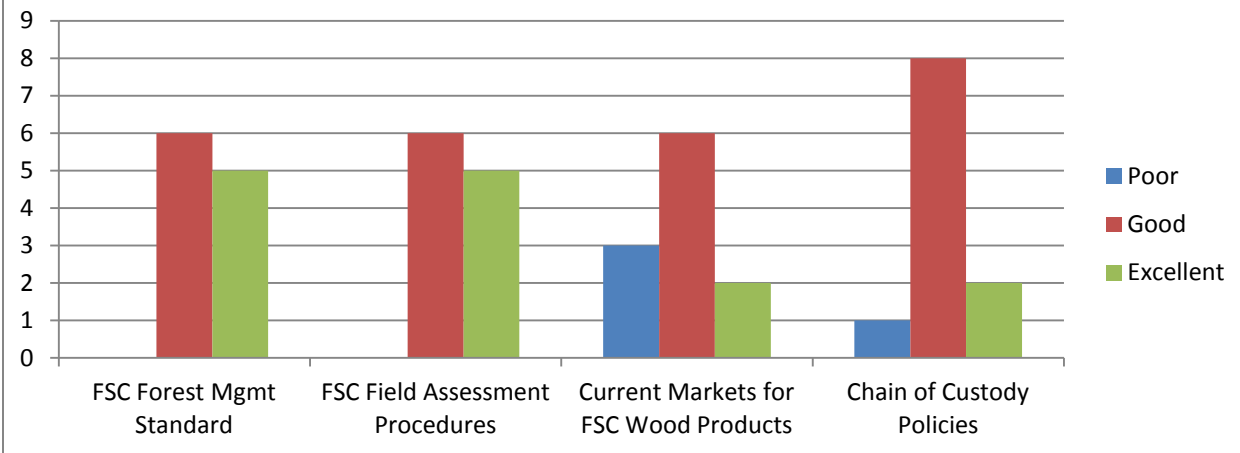
Please rate your knowledge of the subject prior to the workshop:
