

Upcoming Season Creation Workshops

Rural Action and Green Edge Organic Gardens are partnering on a series of intensive on-farm workshops for agriculture and natural resource professionals. The workshops are held at Green Edge Organic Gardens (16232 Henry Rd. Amesville, Ohio 45711). Sessions begin at the Amesville Grange Hall (17486 State St. Amesville, Ohio 45711) then go to the farm and end at 4:00 pm. These trainings focus primarily on the use of high tunnels for the creation of winter production, focusing on multiple aspects of the Green Edge Organic Gardens model of year round farming. The workshops include both on-farm and classroom portions and are taught by the farmers.
