About the Program

Our goal is to establish and train a cohort of 12 leaders who will advance communications with farmers, ranchers, professionals, and communities about sustainable agritourism.

Costs and Expectations

- Lodging and program costs paid by the Western SARE grant
- Participants pay for travel costs
- Full participation is expected and attendance at all seminars is mandatory.

How Does It Work?

Over the course of 2 years, fellows will attend 4 unique 2-day seminars hosted at various sustainable agritourism operations across Montana consisting of workshops, tours, and networking opportunities.

Program Details

Fellows will gain sustainable agriculture/agritourism knowledge and skills through exposure to industry issues, experiences, and experts.

Fellows will learn how to advocate for sustainable agritourism and conduct outreach events for industry promotion.
