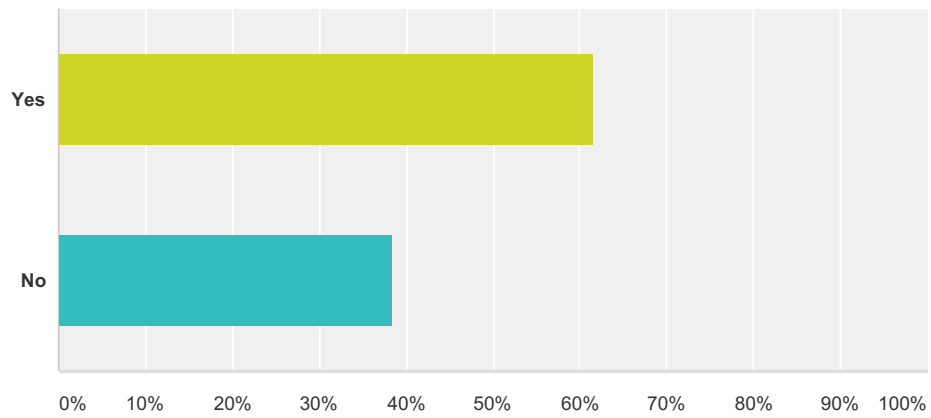


### Q1 This was my first introduction to bison production.

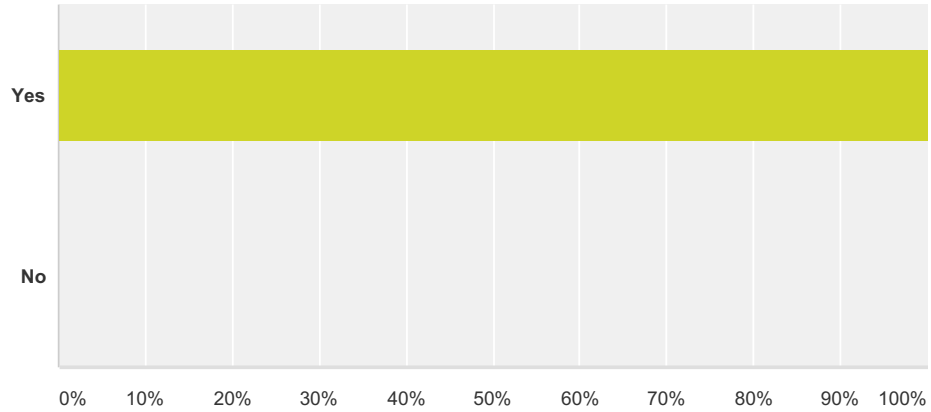
