

For the love of bees!

Oregon grows the best clover seed in the world. These seeds result from a tight relationship between growers and their wild bumble bees. Clover fields support high and diverse populations of bumble bees that, in turn pollinate the crop. The Oregon Clover Commission takes pollinator protection seriously and that's why they developed an industry-leading Bee Protection Protocol.

Planting instructions: Select a sunny location. Clear an area 25 sq feet; remove grass and other plants, loosen the soil and make it level and smooth. Spread the seed as evenly as possible. Smooth with back of garden rake, but do not cover; water gently. Seedlings will emerge in approximately 7 to 21 days. Keep the soil evenly moist until seedlings are 2" tall. Plant in fall or early spring for season-long bloom.

This packet contains: 27% balansa clover, 20% mihi-persian, 20% hubrum clover, 12% arrowleaf clover, 11% crimson clover, 10% common vetch.
