Farm Lectures

10:00a – 10:50a Managing Forages for Farm and Livestock Well-being

Bill Thurston, with Gingersnap Farm & Seed, will be discussing principles in managing forage and livestock production. Protecting soil health and utilizing cover crops

11:00a – 11:50a Farm Planning for Soil Health

Alex Case-Cohen, Director of the Pend Oreille Conservation District, will discussion the components of a conservation farm plan. 1:00p – 1:50p Soil Health Practices: Harnessing the Microbiome

Tarah Sullivan, WSU Soil Health Scientist will discuss the life in the soil interactions, improving soil health to improve production and reduce the impacts of drought and weather conditions. Tarah will be introducing the Washington State Soil Health Initiative programs and legislation.
