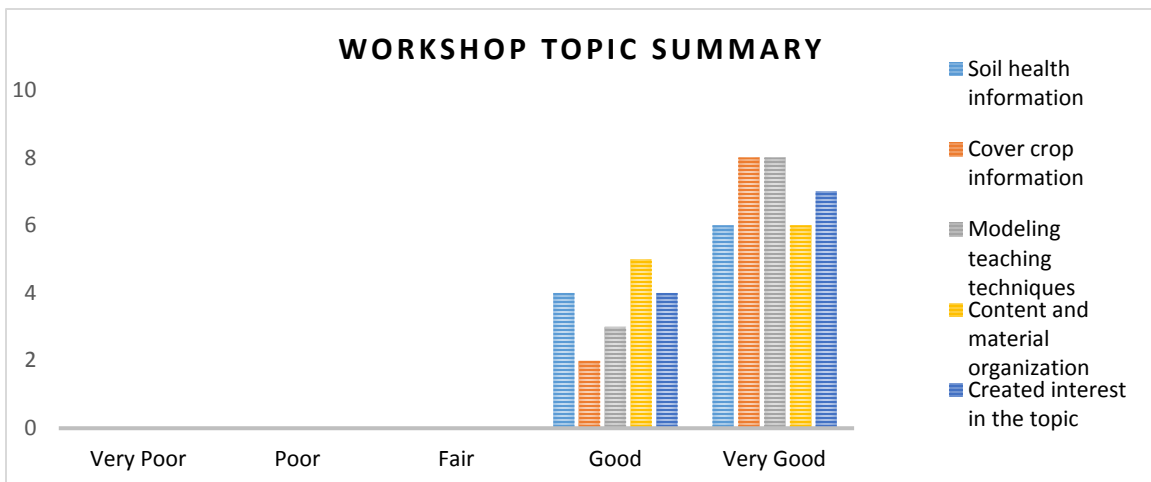
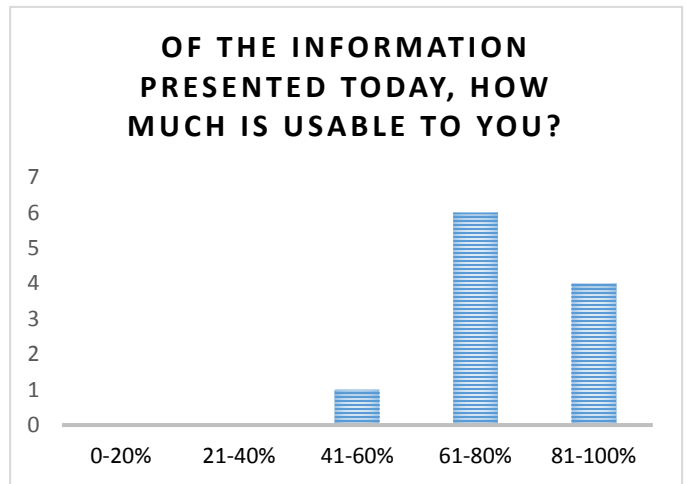
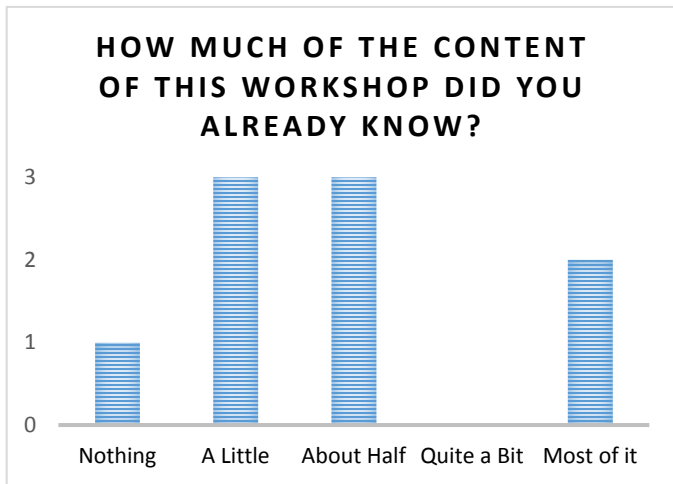
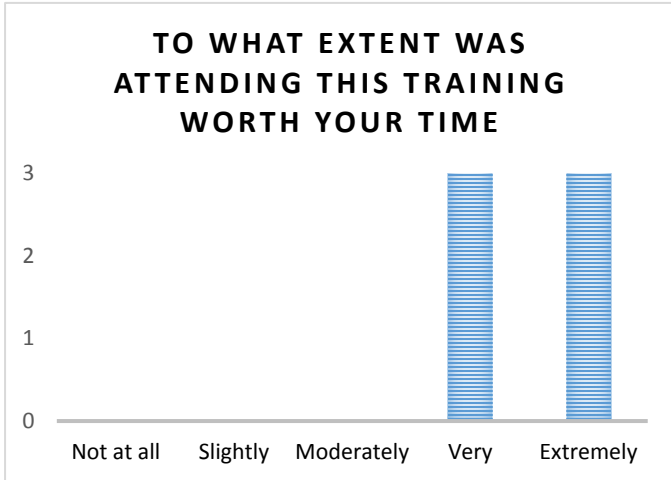
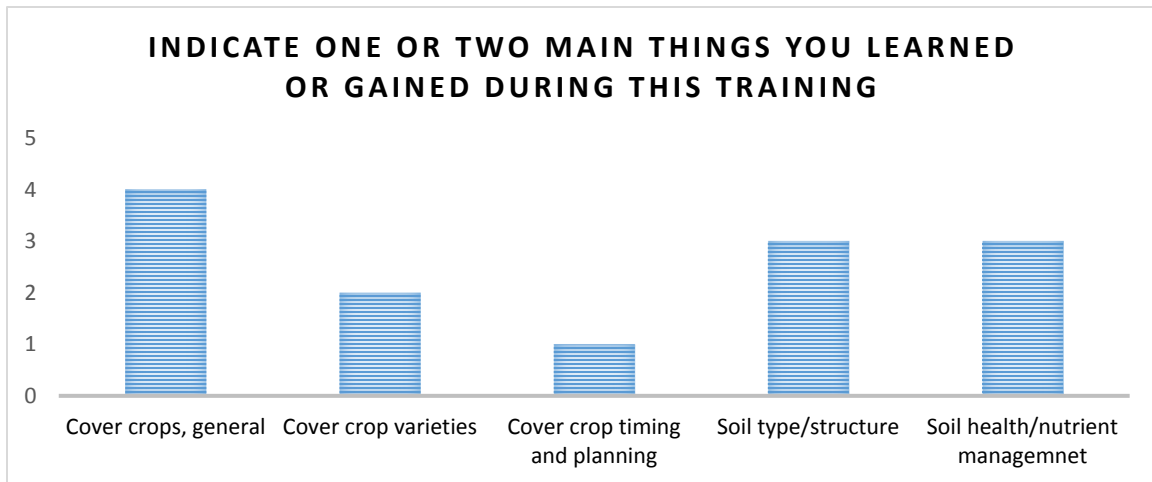


End of Session Evaluation for “Soil Health, Nutrient Management, and Cover Cropping” workshop presented in Red Lake, MN September 13-14, 2017.

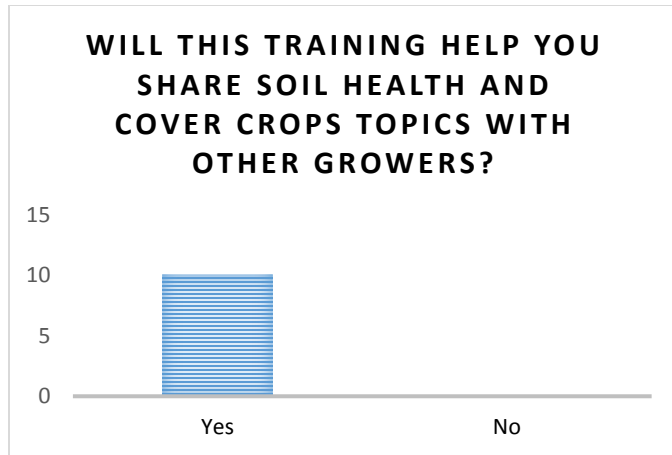
- Tailoring the cover crop to the vegetables planted
