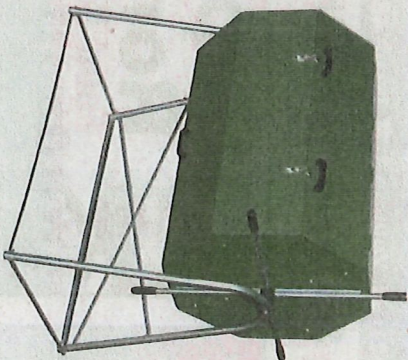
Oneida Nation has received a \$8,718 grant for a community composting project
