- 9. Do you provide support or programming on improving soil health? If yes, what have you done?
- 10. Where do you help farmers connect to resources? Any of the following: University, Extension, USDA (NRCS, FSA, etc.) or other sources?
 - a. If yes, how did that go for them?
 - b. If no, any reasons why? (for ex. lack of awareness about these sources? or lack of trust? or potential information does not seem useful?)
- 11. Would you be interested in getting resources on raising livestock, grazing livestock on pasture or managing soil health to share with the farmers you support?
